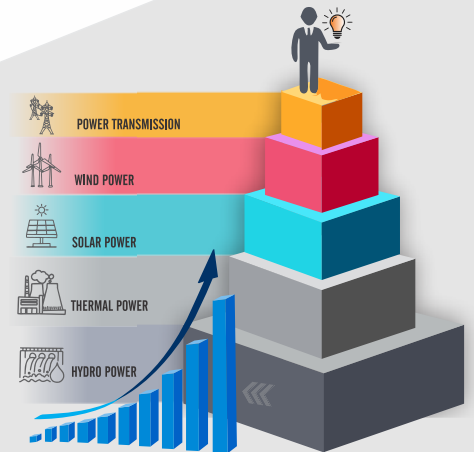

Dear SJVNites,

I would like to begin my message by congratulating every SJVNite on achieving the certificate of Great Place to Work® by Great Place To Work® India. SJVN has achieved the glorious certification for the second consecutive year. This recognition is a testament to our unwavering dedication to employee well-being and collaborative work environment. It also highlights collective efforts of Team SJVN to create a culture of trust, excellence and growth.

Added yet another feather to SJVN’s cap of achievements, SGEL has successfully achieved COD of 241.77 MW capacity in Phase-I of 1000 MW Bikaner Solar Power Project on 2nd April 2025. The entire project is planned for commissioning by 30th September 2025 marking a major stride towards our green energy goal.

I am glad to share that SJVN has signed an MOU with Govt. of

Bihar for 1000 MW Hathidah Durgawati Pumped Storage Project. The estimated cost of the project is Rs. 5,663 crores. Another MoU of INR 9,500 Cr was inked with Government of Chhattisgarh and Chhattisgarh State Power Generation Company Limited (CSPGCL) for development of 1800 MW Kotpali Pumped Storage Project (PSP) in Chhattisgarh.

Our flagship Hydro Power Stations have yet again set new benchmarks in energy generation. 1500 MW NJHPS achieved its third highest annual generation of 7421.453 MU in FY2024-25, setting multiple new records including highest single-day and monthly generation. 412 MW Rampur HPS generated 2073.9971 MU, exceeding its MoU target and recorded second highest generation in a decade. 60 MW Naitwar Mori HPS generated 316.41MU, surpassing its design energy and contributing to SJVN’s strong overall performance.

1500 MW NJHPS has also

been honoured with the CBIP Award for Best maintained Project in Hydro Sector for FY 2024-25. This recognition highlights our unwavering commitment to operational excellence and nation-building.

Looking at project progress, we can see that significant progress have been made across multiple projects. In 66 MW Dhaulasidh HEP, cumulative 65% works have been completed and works of dam concreting, Power House works and penstock erection are in advance stage. In 210 MW Luhri Stage-1 HEP, overall, 51% physical progress has been achieved and work related to cavity treatment & restoration of diversion tunnel are in full swing.

Meanwhile, at 1320 MW Buxar Thermal Power Project, cumulative 87% of works have been completed. For Unit-1, work of Chimney & Structure erection of STG-1 has been completed and erection of Boiler-1, ESP-1 and STG-1 equipments are in advance stage of completion. Further,

work of Phase-1 has also been completed for alternate Coal transportation arrangement through Multi modal Gati Shakti Cargo terminal on 31.03.2025.

In 900 Arun-3 HEP, cumulative 68% works have been completed so far. HRT excavation has been completed and lining is in progress. Works in the powerhouse complex are in advance stage. Restoration of right bank dam abutment and dam concreting is in progress. 50% work of transmission line has also been completed.

In 382 MW Sunni Dam HEP, 28% works have been completed so far. Excavation of dam left abutment has been completed and right abutment is in progress. Excavation of MAT, Powerhouse cavern, Transformer Hall cavern, Tail Race Tunnels and Adit to Pressure shaft are in progress. EM works Package for the Project is also under tendering.

SJVN successfully hosted its first-ever Customer Meet in New Delhi, fostering meaningful engagement with stakeholders and DISCOMs. The event served as a platform to exchange ideas, address emerging challenges and strengthen partnerships. 1500 MW NJHPS organised 23rd Edition of Vendor Development Meet for MSMEs which was a great success. I believe that such meets play an important role in fostering an inclusive ecosystem where MSMEs can grow and succeed.

Taking another step towards betterment of the society, SJVN and PSMRI came together to

launch Mobile Medical Unit in Arunachal Pradesh. This collaboration intends to play a transformative role in delivering essential healthcare services to the people of Arunachal Pradesh, ensuring access even in remote locations. This initiative included essential medical facilities and offered services like free medical constructions, diagnostic needs, medicines and emergency care.

Further, SJVN organised blood donation camp at its Corporate Headquarters in Shimla. A total of 204 persons voluntarily donated blood, setting a new record at Corporate Headquarters in Shimla. In FY-2024-25 similar Blood Donation Camps were organised by RHPS & LHEP-1. Such initiatives reiterate our values and commitment to the betterment of society.

SJVN successfully organised 'SJVN Udbhav 2025' featuring Quiz Contest namely, Gyanotkarsh and a Presentation Contest- Navdrishti, for its employees based on the theme 'Igniting Minds, Igniting Ideas'. Employees posted at various projects & offices of SJVN presented innovative ideas on Company's growth, sustainability, excellence and future plans. With enthusiastic participation and insightful discussions, the event succeeded in achieving its goal of employees engagement, knowledge sharing and fostering a spirit of healthy competition.

On the occasion of International Women's Day 2025, SJVN

organised an event on the theme 'Accelerate Action'. This theme highlighted the importance of taking swift and decisive steps to achieve gender equality and women's empowerment.

SJVNites have been performing exceptionally well in sports events organised by various CPSUs under the aegis of Power Sports Control Board. Congratulations to team SJVN for their outstanding performance and victory over BBMB in the final of the 24th ICPSU Kabaddi tournament in Jharkhand. SJVN has also secured 1st place in women's doubles and 2nd & 3rd in individuals events at 27th Inter CPSU Table Tennis Tournament organised by REC in Lucknow. SJVN also hosted 24th ICPSU Cricket Tournament with the objective of fostering sportsmanship and leadership qualities. These tournaments foster teamwork and excellence and SJVN encourage active participation in sports.

With all the positivity in mind and determination to excel in the coming times, let us walk zealously ahead on the path of progress and keep ourselves motivated to achieve our shared vision of 25000 MW by 2030 and 50000 MW by 2040.
