Dear SJVNites,

SJVN takes pride in being a partner in the nation's growth story. With a strong foundation and unwavering commitment to growth and progress, we continue to seize opportunities and transform them into accomplishments. In a historic moment, SJVN synchronized its first ever Thermal Project- Buxar Thermal Power Project (BTPP) in Bihar with the National Grid on 21st August 2025. Subsequently, the First 660 MW Unit of BTPP was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi on 22nd August 2025, marking this day in golden history of SJVN's success. The Project will significantly enhance power availability in the state of Bihar and in the Eastern Region, reduce peak-hour shortages and strengthen energy security.

Adding to its project milestones, SJVN successfully achieved COD of 100.25 MW capacity in the 1000 MW Bikaner Solar Power Project in Rajasthan. With this, the total commissioned capacity of the

project now stands at 501.02 MW.

I congratulate you all for prestigious 'SCOPE Eminence Award in Human Resource Management', presented by Hon'ble President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu to SJVN. This proud achievement reflects SJVN's progressive and people-centric HR practices and commitment to employee development. SJVN has also been conferred with Ministry of Power's Vishesh Puraskar- 'Rajbhasha Prabha' for excellence in implementation of Official Language Policy. The award was presented by Hon'ble Union Minister of Power and Housing and Urban Affairs, Sh. Manohar Lal, in New Delhi.

Looking at project progress, we can see that significant progress has been made across multiple projects. In 66 MW Dhaulasidh HEP, cumulative 69% works have been completed and works of Dam concreting, Power House concreting and Penstock Erection are in advance stage. In 210 MW

Luhri Stage -1 HEP, overall, 51% physical progress has been achieved and work related to cavity treatment & restoration of Diversion Tunnel are in progress. In 900 MW Arun-3 HEP, cumulative 70% works have been completed. HRT heading has been completed and lining is in progress. Works in the Power House complex are in advance stage and Erection of Electro-Mechanical components is in progress. Dam Concreting is in progress and 44% Concreting has been completed while 55% work of Transmission Line has also been completed. In 382 MW Sunni Dam HEP, 30% works have been completed so far. Excavation works at dam's left abutment has been completed and right abutment excavation is in progress. Excavation of MAT, Power House Cavern, Transformer Hall cavern, Tail Race Tunnels and Adit to Pressure Shaft are in progress.

SJVN signed Power Sale agreement and Power Purchase Agreement with UPPCL and Power Purchase

Agreement with NDMC for power supply from its upcoming hydroelectric projects. These agreements mark a significant step towards realizing SJVN's commitment to the clean energy transition and strengthening power infrastructure for urban consumers. SJVN in collaboration with Department of Public Enterprises, successfully hosted a two-day Orientation Programme on 'Capacity Building of CMDs and Functional Directors of CPSEs' at Dharamshala. The programme featured insightful and interactive sessions on leadership in driving performance, transformation and sustainable growth of Central Public Sector Enterprises.

SJVN had the privilege of hosting members of Parliamentary Committee on Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Labour, Textiles and Skill Development and the Joint Parliamentary Committee on The Constitution (One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth Amendment) Bill, 2024 and the Union Territories Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 (One Nation, One Election) during their visit to Himachal Pradesh. These visits provided valuable opportunities for SJVN to share progress on its ongoing initiatives and engage on issues of national importance.

In addition to these events and remarkable achievements, SJVN has actively engaged in initiatives reflecting its strong social and environmental commitment. Upholding the tradition, various competitions were conducted aligned with the theme 'Ending Plastic Pollution'. An e-waste collection drive was organized

through which approximately 30 kilograms of electronic waste was collected for safe and responsible disposal.

With an aim to give back to society and serve communities, SJVN organised the fifth edition of 'Sauhard', an exhibition-cum-outreach program, under its My Social Responsibility (MSR) initiative. This unique initiative was aligned with Swachhata Pakhwada this year and aimed to instill a culture of compassion and social sensitivity among its employees, while positively impacting lives within the immediate ecosystem. SJVN employees voluntarily donated mementoes, surplus household items and other useful articles, which were exhibited at the Multi-Purpose Hall and subsequently distributed to low-income outsourced workers deployed by various contractors at the Corporate Headquarters.

SJVN observed World Blood Donor Day, with the theme 'Give Blood, Give Hope: Together We Save Lives'. On this occasion regular blood donors were felicitated and SJVNites were encouraged to contribute voluntarily, reinforcing our collective commitment to saving lives through regular blood donation.
