I'll be open to it, says just-retired Pujara on possible coaching career

NEW DELHI, Aug 28: Having bid adieu to his stellar international career, a veteran Indian Test batsman, Cheteshwar Pujara wouldn't mind a coaching stint or a role at the ICC's Centre of Excellence in the next stage of his cricketing journey.



Speaking to PTI days after announcing his retirement from all forms of cricket, Pujara not only gave a sneak peek into his future plans but also stressed on the importance of old school Test match batting.

He also reflected on his glorious 103-Test career, that yielded over 7,000 runs, his series winning performance in Australia, and the contributions of his father and late mother.

"I've enjoyed the broadcast work for sure. So, I'll definitely continue doing that. When it comes to coaching or my work at the ICC (Centre of Excellence), I'll be open to it," Pujara said.

"I haven't genuinely thought about it. Whenever

there is any opportunity which arises, I'll try and take a call then. I've mentioned this earlier also that I would like to stay attached to the game.

"So, in whatever manner I can contribute to Indian cricket, I'll be more than happy to do so," he added.

The thought of retiring from the ground did not cross

Pujara's mind and he leaves the game with no regrets.

But he acknowledged that Test cricket is hardly played in the classical way nowadays even though the relevance of conventional batsmen remains very much intact.

Pujara was commiserating in the UK where a young In-

dian is given the five-match series. Over the course of the series one saw an unbridled aggression from the likes of Virat Kohli and Ben Duckett but at the same time, K.L. Rahul at the top of the order presented a picture of calm.

Having said that, the classical form of Test match batting is dying out. Does it make someone like Pujara sad?

"I don't think I am sad. I still feel that even in the current era, there is scope for a classical Test match player. But times have changed. One needs to move on with the times," he said.

"And I had to tell myself to a strong player, I would definitely say that you should choose playing all three formats of this game because we are seeing more white ball cricket now," he added.

The reason, according to him, is that players are getting picked in the Test squad based on their performances in the IPL or in the ODI squad.

"So when you perform well in white ball cricket, you

are automatically given a chance to represent the Indian Test team. And that's why their game is on the aggressive side," he explained.

But then he also cited the examples of Abhinav Easwaran and Karun Nair, who are getting in after performing well in Ranji Trophy.

"So there is still a scope for players who are doing well in Ranji Trophy and still getting picked in the Test squad," said Pujara, who was India's rock at number three for more than a decade.

In the England series, K.L. Rahul was one of the stand-out batters. He played the old fashioned way at the top of the order and got the desired results. For Pujara, Rahul's approach as an opener was a lesson of hope for classical Test batting, which meant wearing out the bowlers like he did brilliantly.

"He is one of the best Test batters we have currently in the squad. He is one of the most technically correct players in the Indian team. Also, it is good that he is opening

the innings which is also setting the foundation for the entire team.

"We also saw that he performed well in Australia and then his form slipped a bit but now he is working on it... he is carrying on with his focus, converting his starts into big scores which is a positive thing to see.

"Hope he carries on like that not just in Test cricket but in other formats as well," said Pujara.

Retirement sinking in, compliment from Kohli

Though Pujara last played for India in 2022, he remained an active cricketer training for Saamantika in Ranji Trophy and county cricket. He was planning to play another domestic season when he was commenting on the game in England but he came back to Rajkot and took the call to move on.

"I'm really missing it. But at the same time, I'm really overwhelmed with all the love and support provided by all the family members, friends and my teammates, the

coaches I've worked with, the cricket fans," he said.

Was it the murmurs of fellow-seen the Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma that prompted Pujara to say goodbye to the game?

"When I was in the UK, I was actually looking forward to this season. But once I came back home, I was sitting in And when I was about to start my preparation for the Ranji Trophy, I wanted to speak to my family, to my friends, some of my colleagues. What are their thoughts on me playing this season?

"Because I knew that if I played another season, I would be playing a spot in the team and I didn't want to do that. And I was 100 per cent sure that I wanted to carry on playing the entire season.

"So I thought that it was the best time for me to move on and provide an opportunity to the younger player who can be part of the Saamantika team."

Pujara, who faced 16217 balls in his Test career, allowed the likes of Kohli to

play their natural game as he utilised the pressure from the other side.

On Kohli saying that he made life easier for him as a batsman, Pujara said "It's a nice compliment from Virat. He's a great player."

"And if he's saying that I've made his life easier, that really means a lot because if you're a batsman, your job is to ensure that the batsmen who bat at number 3, 5, 6, you make their life easier."

India have not found a world number three since Pujara left the senior. Does he see anyone in the current team performing that tough role in the long run?

"Well, it's very hard to say at this stage. But Indian team has a lot of strong, talented players. Someone like Sai Sudhakar has started this journey well. We saw some potential in his batting."

"At the same time, Karun Nair also scored a 50, though he was batting at number 5. Both Sai and Karun have shown a lot of potential going forward." (PTI)

Tajikistan test awaits India in CAFA Nations Cup opener

ISHOR (Tajikistan), Aug 28: India begin their campaign against co-hosts Tajikistan in their first ever CAFA Nations Cup participation here on Friday, far away from the turmoil the clubs of the 23-member squad have been facing due to the uncertainty over the firing of Indian Super League (ISL).

Newly-appointed head coach Khalid Jamil's task is cut out as he is taking the eight-nation tournament of mostly Central Asian countries as a preparation for the more crucial Asian Cup qualifying round matches against Singapore on October 9 and 14.

Jamil also had to come here without Mohan Bagan Super Giant players, seven of whom were not released by the club on the ground that the tournament does not strictly fall in the FIFA international match window.

Star striker Sunil Chhetra was also left out after Jamil spoke in his "as it is just a preparatory tournament" for the more important Asian Cup qualifiers.

All the 23 players are from ISL clubs, some of whom have either stopped payments or operations of their first teams after the organisers ISL put the top-tier league on hold in a decision on July 11 due to the re-annulment of the Master Rights Agreement (MRA) signed in 2010 with the All India Football Federation (AIFF) and set to expire on December 8.

India have been placed in Group B, and after Friday, they face Iran on September 1 and Afghanistan on September 4.

Group A, meanwhile, consists of co-hosts Uzbekistan, Kyrgyz Republic, Turkmenistan, and Oman.

The top teams from each group will play each other in the final, while the two second-placed teams will face off in the third-place match, both to be played on September 8.

Jamil sounded satisfied with his side's 10-day preparatory camp in Bishkay, preceding the tournament.

"We had a good preparation for the CAFA Nations Cup. Every player worked

hard before coming here. It is a pleasure for me to participate in this tournament," he said at the pre-match press conference.

India and Tajikistan have played each other five times in the past, with the Central Asian country winning three. The Blue Tigers' only win against Tajikistan came in the AFC Challenge Cup 2008 final, where India defeated the Persian Lions 4-1.

That result was 18 years ago, and Tajikistan 110th in FIFA rankings are a different side now. Jamil is fully aware of the threats that the opponents pose to India (137th in FIFA Rankings), but is more focussed on the Blue Tigers playing their own game.

"Yes, we know about them (Tajikistan). They are a strong side and have done well recently. But we must focus on our own game and be mentally prepared," said Jamil.

"It is important for us to play as a unit and keep in-

proving every match. The process will take time. We must focus on both the juniors and the seniors to build a strong unit for the future matches."

The India head coach stressed the importance of spreading positivity in the team.

"We must think fresh, we must think positive. Yes, this is an away game against a good team, but we have to prepare accordingly and think only of one thing - a positive result. All the players must take responsibility. I feel that we are ready to accept this challenge."

India goalscorer Hritvik Tswini, who accompanied his coach at the press conference, said, "We have trained hard over the last few weeks, and our camp in Bishkay gave us an intense 10 days to get ready for the CAFA Nations Cup. I am sure everyone is excited to play this tournament and ready to give their best." (PTI)

Glory with gun: Visually impaired Army officer sets eyes on winning gold at shooting World Cup

INDORE, Aug 28: Lieutenant Colonel Dwarakish, an accomplished marksman, lost his vision in an accident a few years ago, but that did not dent his determination to excel in sports and he has now set his eyes on winning a gold medal for India in the ensuing World Cup for visually impaired shooters.

The 38-year-old Army officer, who prefers to use one name, competes in the 10 metre air rifle category of shooting.

It's fun-up to the World Cup. Dwarakish, probably the only visually impaired officer serving in the Army currently, has been practising for a year at the Army Marksmanship Unit (AMU) in Mhow, a military cantonment, located about 25km from Indore city. At shooting competitions,

he aims with the help of a device that indicates the target through sound (audio ranging device).

Talking to PTI on Thursday, Dwarakish revealed he always wanted to be a soldier and alongside also take part in sports.

"I wanted to join the Army since childhood and my dream came true in 2009. Even after joining the Army, I remained associated with sports. After losing my eyes in an accident a few years later, I did not understand for a long time what to do next."

"However, in 2022, I came to know for the first time that there are international competitions for visually impaired shooters. Then I decided to move forward in this direction (take part in such events)," said the officer.

He noted that competitors for visually impaired shooters have been going on in different countries for a very long time, but in India, such events at the national level started only a few years ago.

Dwarakish informed that he has won gold medals in the last two national competitions in the 10 metre air rifle pistol category.

Boosted by his exploits at national competitions in India, the officer said he has now set a target of winning a gold medal in the visually impaired category of the Paralympic World Cup to be held in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) in October- November.

Apart from shooting, Dwarakish has also excelled in different national-level swimming competitions and has an adventurous streak.

In 2021, he was part of a group of eight persons with disabilities who created a record by scaling the world's highest waterfall, the Sheshan Falls, a 1,200-metre high waterfall in Jharkhand, where temperatures dip to below -35 degrees Celsius and descend to a complete phenological zero. The officer found the state ChairGPT, a popular, generative artificial intelligence chatbot, to understand the latest developments and risks of shooting, and his focus is on achieving his sporting goals.

Sharing facets of his life, Dwarakish said, "From my experiences so far, I have learned that hard work never fails. If you keep moving forward on your path while working hard, then one day, you will definitely reach your destination." (PTI)



Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to Government of Arunachal Pradesh online proposal No. FP/AR/HYD/IRRIG/462857/2024 on the above mentioned subject, seeking prior approval of Central Government under Section 2 (1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980, and to say that the said proposal has been examined by the Advisory Committee (AC) constituted by the Central Government under Section- 3 of the aforesaid Act.

2. After careful consideration of the proposal of the Government of Arunachal Pradesh and on the basis of the recommendations of the Advisory Committee (AC), the Central Government hereby agrees to accord **Stage-1 / In-principle** approval Section 2 (1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 in favour of Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam Ltd. (SJVN) for non-forestry use of 1175.03 ha. of unclassed forest land for construction of Etalin Hydro Electric Project (3097 MW) on Dri River and Talo (Tangon) river within the jurisdiction of Anini Forest Division, District- Dibang Valley in the State of Arunachal Pradesh subject to the following conditions:

1. General Conditions

1.1	Legal status of the diverted forest land shall remain unchanged
1.2	The land identified for the purpose of CA shall be clearly depicted on a Survey of India toposheet of

1.3	The User Agency shall transfer the cost of raising and maintaining the Compensatory Afforestation as per the approved CA Scheme at the current wage rate in consultation with State Forest Department in the account of CAMPA of the concerned State through online portal. The scheme may include appropriate provision for anticipated cost increase for works schedule for subsequent years;
1.4	The State Government shall charge the Net Present Value (NPV) of the forest land being diverted under this proposal from the User Agency as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 28.03.2008, 24.04.2008 and 09.05.2008 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. 202/1995 and the guidelines issued by this Ministry vide its letter No. 5-3/2007-FC (pt.) dated 29.12.2023 in this regard;
1.5	At the time of payment of the Net Present Value (NPV) at the then prevailing rate, the User Agency shall furnish an undertaking to pay the additional amount of NPV, if so determined, as per the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India;
1.6	The Compensatory levies to be realized from the User Agency under the project shall be transferred/ deposited, through e-challan, in to the account of National Authority, CAMPA pertaining to the State concerned through e-portal (https://parivesh.nic.in/);
1.7	The State Government shall complete settlement of rights, in term of the Scheduled Tribes and Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006, if any, on the forest land to be diverted as per the sub-rule (7) of Rule 11 of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Rules, 2023;
1.8	The complete compliance report shall be uploaded on e-portal (https://parivesh.nic.in/);
1.9	The KML files of proposed area for diversion and the CA area shall be uploaded on the e-Green watch portal with all requisite details prior to Stage II approval;
1.10	The user agency shall explore the possibility of translocation of maximum number of trees identified to be felled and shall ensure that any tree felling shall be done only when it is unavoidable and that too under strict supervision of the State Forest Department;
1.11	The cost of felling of trees shall be deposited by the User Agency with the State Forest Department;
1.12	The User Agency shall obtain the Environment Clearance as per the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, if required;
1.13	No labour camp shall be established on the forest land and no work shall be allowed after sunset;
1.14	The User Agency shall provide fuels preferably alternate fuels to the labourers and the staff working at the site so as to avoid any damage and pressure on the nearby forest areas;
1.15	No additional or new path will be constructed inside the forest area for transportation of construction materials for execution of the project work;

1.16	The boundary of the diverted forest land shall be demarcated on ground at the project cost, by erecting four feet high reinforced cement concrete pillars, each inscribed with its serial number, distance from pillar to pillar and GPS coordinates;
1.17	The period of diversion under this approval shall be co-terminus with the period of lease to be granted in favour of the user agency or the project life, whichever is less;
1.18	The layout plan of the proposal shall not be changed without the prior approval of the Central Government and the forest land shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified in the proposal;
1.19	The forest land proposed to be diverted shall under no circumstances be transferred to any other agency, department or person without prior approval of the Central Government;
1.20	No damage to the flora, fauna or the environment of the adjoining area shall be caused; Adequate measures to ensure no damage to the adjoining areas should be taken by the User Agency at the project cost;
1.21	The concerned Divisional Forest Officer, will monitor and take necessary mitigative measures to ensure that there is no adverse impact on the forests in the surrounding area;
1.22	The User Agency shall submit the annual self -compliance report in respect of the above stated conditions to the State Government, concerned Regional Office and to this Ministry by the end of March every year regularly;
1.23	Any other condition that the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change may stipulate from time to time in the interest of conservation, protection and development of forests & wildlife shall be carried with by the State Government and user agency;
1.24	The user agency shall comply all the provisions of all Acts, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Hon'ble Court Order (s) and NGT Order (s) pertaining to this project, if any, for the time being in force, as applicable to the project; and
1.25	Violation of any of these conditions will amount to violation of Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 and action would be taken as prescribed in para 1.16 of Chapter 1 of the consolidated guidelines and clarifications issued under Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980 and Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Rules, 2023 as issued by this Ministry's letter No. 5-2/2017-FC dated 29.12.2023.

2.1	The Compensatory Afforestation over degraded forest land double in extent to the forest land being diverted i.e. 839.06 ha, 811 ha and 700 ha in Tenga RF, Bomdila RF and Doimukh RF respectively, shall be raised by the State Forest Department at the project cost within two years from the date of grant of Stage- II approval;

3.2	The project mitigation and wildlife Management Plan based on the recommendation of the WII, should be suitable executed by the State Forest Department;
3.3	The State Government shall constitute a committee comprising of Regional Conservator of Forests, Divisional Forest Officer and representative of user agency to oversee the implementation of the provisions of Wildlife Management Plan. Annual reports of the said Committee, duly concurred by the CWLW of the State, shall be submitted to the Regional Office of the Ministry at Shillong;
3.4	High-level Empowered Committee, constituted by the State Government under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner, Dibang Valley shall address the concerns raised in the various representations received on the proposal and take appropriate action to resolve and settle issues in accordance with the relevant statutes and norms;
3.5	A copy of the approved Catchment Area Treatment Plan shall be submitted along with the compliance of in-principle approval by the State and cost of implementation shall be realized from the user agency and deposited in to the account of State CAMPA managed by the National Authority, CAMPA;
3.6	The user agency shall obtain approval from the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA) for the construction, maintenance, and operation of the proposed HEPs and the same shall be submitted to the Ministry along with the compliance of in-principle approval;
3.7	Requisite statutory approval for undertaking quarrying in the area during the construction phase of the project shall be obtained from the concerned Department of the State by the user agency and a copy of the same along with the Mining Plan, shall be submitted to the Ministry along with the compliance of in-principle approval;
3.8	A muck disposal plan, approved by the competent authority in the State to ensure safe disposal of muck at the designated sites shall be submitted along with the compliance of in-principle approval;
3.9	To prevent muck rolling down from the slopes, the user agency shall construct the breast wall/river bank protection wall to contain the muck and prevent it from going to the adjacent streams/rivers. A Plan/scheme of the same shall be submitted along with the compliance of in-principle approval;
3.10	To increase the ambit of social and economic benefit of the project affected families, inclusion of affected areas of Lower Dibang District within the target beneficiaries of the project should be done with the formal approval of the Ministry of Power, Government of India;

3.11	To strengthen the monitoring and protection of the forests, the user agency shall assist the Forest Department as under: a. The user agency shall purchase and install one VSAT in the HQ of Anini Forest Division and provide for its maintenance for a period of at least 3 years. b. The user agency shall provide necessary assistance to the Forest Department to carry out monitoring and forest protection activities.
3.12	The State Govt. shall obtain the comments of the Fishery Department of the State on the measures proposed for conservation and protection of aquatic fauna such as fish passages/ladders and supporting fish hatcheries and the same shall be submitted to the MoEF&CC along with the compliance of in-principle approval.
3.13	The user agency shall ensure that E-flows are maintained as per the recommendations made in the Carrying Capacity and Cumulative Impact Assessment Study conducted for the River basin;
3.14	Annual site inspection of the area to monitor the compliance of conditions of approval granted under the Adhinyam should be mandatorily done jointly by the Regional Office, Shillong and the State Forest Department.
3.15	The State Government shall ensure that User Agency shall undertake the R&R Plan as per the R&R Policy of State Government in consonance with National R&R Policy, Government of India before the commencement of the project work and implementation. The said R&R Plan will be monitored by the State Government/Regional Office of MoEF&CC along with indicators for monitoring and expected observable milestones.

After receipt of compliance report on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above, the proposal shall be considered for final approval under section 2 (1) (ii) of the Van (Sanrakshan Evam Samvardhan) Adhinyam, 1980. Transfer of forest land shall not be affected till final approval is granted by the Central Government in this regard.

It has been found that there is no change in the baseline conditions in the area since the submission of the Wildlife Conservation Plan. Therefore, the Wildlife Conservation Plan is applicable in the present circumstances. However the cost of the plan has been revised keeping in mind the increased cost index since 2019. (Copy is enclosed as Annexure-A)

EDS Point No. 10:

In this regard this is to mention that Etalin HEP project site is 13 Km away from the nearest boundary of Dibang Wildlife Sanctuary, hence, there is no possibility of any direct adverse impact of the project activities within the Wildlife Sanctuary. However, Wildlife Conservation Plan has been prepared by Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun and duly approved by the Chief Wildlife Warden to mitigate any likely impact of the project on the wildlife.
