
कृपया उक्त अनुमोदन का संदर्भ ग्रहण करें, जिसके अनुसार जिला शिमला और मंडी (हिमाचल प्रदेश) में एसजेवीएन द्वारा की सुन्नी बांध एचईपी (382 मेगावाट) परियोजना के लिए मौजा/मोहल खैरा, तहसील- सुन्नी, जिला शिमला, हिमाचल प्रदेश में खैरा क्वारी (10.1529 हेक्टेयर) से रेत, पत्थर और बजरी के संग्रहण/एकत्रीकरण के लिए खनिजों के खनन के लिए पर्यावरण मंजूरी प्रदान की गई है। ईआईए अधिसूचना 2006 और पर्यावरण मंजूरी शर्त संख्या X (iv) के अनुसार, निर्धारित पर्यावरण परिस्थितियों की छमाही स्थिति प्रस्तुत करना अनिवार्य आवश्यकता है। इसके अलावा, दिनांक 26.11.2018 की अधिसूचना के अनुसार अर्धवार्षिक अनुपालना रिपोर्ट सॉफ्ट कॉपी में भी प्रस्तुत करना वांछनीय है। खैरा क्वारी वर्तमान में पूर्णतः अखनित अवस्था में है तथा उक्त खदान क्षेत्र से अभी तक किसी भी प्रकार के खनिज पदार्थ का उत्खनन नहीं किया गया है। अतः उपर्युक्त उल्लिखित शर्तों/प्रावधानों का अनुपालन खनन कार्य प्रारम्भ होने के उपरांत नियमानुसार सुनिश्चित किया जाएगा।

वर्तमान संदर्भ में पर्यावरणीय परिस्थितियों की अनुपालना पर छमाही रिपोर्ट (मार्च, 2026 तक की अवधि हेतु) आपके सूचनार्थ सादर प्रस्तुत की जा रही है।
